Jonah is sometimes known as the most successful, yet reluctant, prophet. God sends Jonah to Nineveh, where life was like the ancient equivalent of Las Vegas on a long weekend with no credit limit. Jonah manages to convert the entire city of Nineveh, all 120,000 people and all their animals (!), to following God, repenting, and living rightly. Yet Jonah is reluctant, petulant, and a brat of a prophet. He runs away from doing what God asks in the beginning (and is returned by the fish/whale) and sulks when God forgives their sins. While Jonah is the main character in the book, it is really God's actions that are the focus. This story shows us the abundant love and care of God for all of God's creatures, human and animal, and is open and available to all who listen for and turn to God. - The Rev.Heather VanDeventer

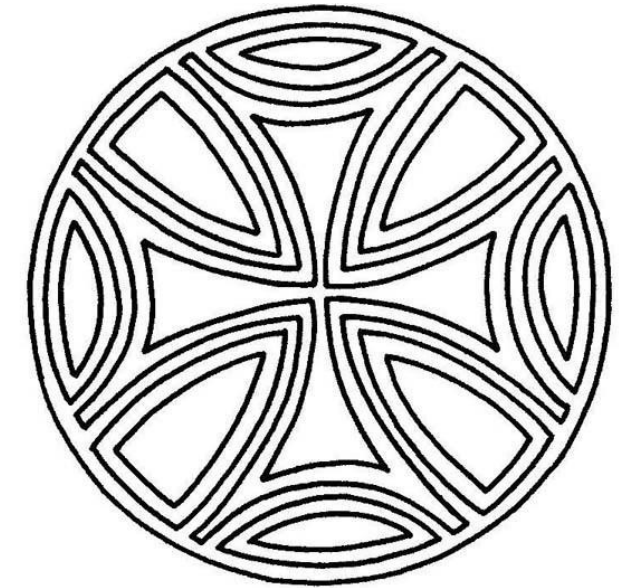

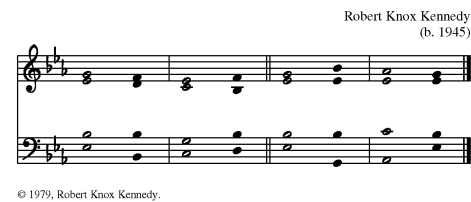
When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it.

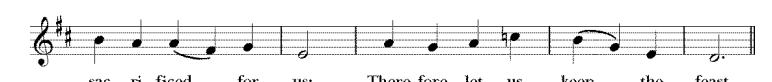
